Here's the first of updates about what's been happening and what's ahead as I prepare for Parliament.

Indi election declared: June 12

It is an extraordinary privilege to be the Member for Indi. I feel that I am one very fortunate person – one now who also understands the very great responsibility that this election brings.

I'm so conscious that I'm standing on the shoulders of giants. There have been extraordinary members for Indi – it's a Federation (1901) seat – and I pay particular tribute to my immediate predecessor, Cathy McGowan AO, the first Independent Member for Indi who served our communities so courageously and so honourably for the past six years.

To all of the people of Indi I say that I will be the very best person that I can be. I know I have a lot to learn but I have a lot to give, and you can be absolutely certain that I'll be doing that with as much honour as I can. I thank you and look forward very much to being your Member for Indi for the next three years.

My priorities: climate action, integrity

I'm keen to get to work with the crossbench to encourage parliament and government to develop a cohesive response to the challenge of climate change that promotes unity rather than division.

A collaborative approach to climate change can enable businesses and communities across the country to advance new opportunities, such as a roll-out of renewable energy projects, especially in rural and regional areas. I think action on climate change is one of two key priorities on which the crossbench will be quite united.

The other is the establishment of a robust federal integrity commission.

I'm optimistic that by working collaboratively with the government, the advantages of so many of the current and proposed projects we've put forward from Indi communities leading into the recent federal election campaign will be realised.

Parliament opens: July 2

I'm to be sworn in as the Independent Federal Member for Indi at Parliament House in Canberra in July 2. This ceremony takes place before the formal opening of the 46th Parliament by Sir Peter Cosgrove AK MC, Governor General, the same day.

Ahead of that – on June 25 and 26 – I'll be joining other newly-elected Members and Senators in an orientation program at Parliament House. I'm looking forward to meeting Zali Steggall, the new Independent Member for Warringah, and later our fellow crossbenchers Andrew Wilkie (Clark), Adam Bandt (Melbourne) and Rebekha Sharkie (Mayo).

First speech: August 1

It's the luck of those of Irish descent that I'm to make my first speech in the House of Representatives on August 1: Horses' Birthday!

I'm aware that quite a few Orange supporters are keen to travel to Canberra for this occasion and in the next week or so you'll receive an email – or via a link on slack – to advise if you'd like to attend.

We can then move ahead and make arrangements, subject to demand, for bus charter and public gallery ticketing in the House of Representatives. If you're to come along make sure you wear a winning colour!

Coalition campaign commitments

The coalition government committed to provide about \$112 million to projects in Indi during the 2019 election campaign. Almost 93 per cent of this sum was promised for projects in Wodonga.


I've already spoken with some local government leaders about their communities' expectations and I'll be contacting others shortly.
